Litigator Brunson in private practice:

Birmingham litigator Ron Brunson has teamed up with former U.S. attorney's office co-worker Henry Frohsin in private practice.

Brunson, who prosecuted a bizarre case involving homeless men who were targeted for murder, has joined Frohsin and partner Jim Barger in an "of counsel" capacity.

He has spent the past five years in solo practice after retiring from the Birmingham U.S. attorney's office, where he and Frohsin worked together as assistant prosecutors. His new firm specializes in corporate abuse and federal whistle-

blower cases.

"There is never a bad time to hold government and large corporations accountable, but this sure seems like a good time," Brunson said.

In 2001, Brunson won a federal criminal case against a Bessemer man found guilty of soliciting murder after taking out life insurance policies on homeless and destitute people. Russell Hubbard --
